

Freedom of Information Request Number: FOI 5924 – Commissioning of Rehabilitation Services

1. Does the CCG directly commission the following services?

- **Rehabilitation following acquired brain injury**
- **Rehabilitation following spinal cord injury**
- **Rehabilitation following complex orthopaedic trauma**

ABI:

Yes, Category C patients (as defined by UKROC) are the least complex and will utilise commissioned NHS services ie rehabilitation beds, community services.

Category B will have rehabilitation in a specialised brain injury unit commissioned by WHCCG (WHCCG commission these placements on behalf of all Hants CCGs and Isle of Wight CCG. These are spot purchased.

Patients with predominantly category A needs (the most complex as defined by UKROC) will be commissioned by NHS England. After the initial phase of rehabilitation they will return to a CCG commissioned rehabilitation placement if this continues to be indicated.

Spinal Cord Injury:

Acute spinal cord injury is commissioned by NHS England and after the initial phase of rehabilitation may continue to receive rehabilitation by acute / community providers.

Complex Orthopaedic Trauma:

Yes through acute provider contracts.

ABI:

The number of patients who have used the services you commissioned over the past 2 years

113 patients have used the services commissioned over the past 2 years.

Snowdon Ward (Solent NHS): 71 patients have used the services commissioned over the past 2 years.

Spot purchasing for ABI CCG commissioned placements through WHCCG ABI pathway. IFR team involved in receiving these requests.

NB: WHCCG commissions ABI specialist rehabilitation placements (patients with predominantly category B needs) for all 5 Hampshire and Isle of Wight CCGs.
